Sunday School registration will be held on Sunday, Sept. 10th with classes beginning on September 17th. Our Confirmation classes will begin on Tuesday, September 19th.



Here are some highlights from Church Council's meetings:

- **Welcome Back Sunday:** This event will be held on Sunday, September 10th with a lunch and fun activities planned following the service.
- A new bike rack: This has been installed in the parking lot by the shed.
- Property: Lighting upgrades were completed in the Sanctuary, Narthex, Blue Room, Fellowship Hall, Pastor's Office and the Admin office with the majority of the costs covered by Efficiency Manitoba.
- **Human Resources:** The committee has put in place processes for the management of Property and coordination for Music and Worship until such time as employees can be found.
- **Community Missions:** The Committee has provided Street Links with 15 dozen eggs every couple of weeks during the summer. Also, the committee is hosting a Fundraising/Appreciation Chili Lunch on October 15. Volunteers from Street Links will help with set up and take down.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for September 12th.

Confirmation starting Tuesday, September 19th from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. New 3 year program

Our confirmation program is being revamped. We are joining up with Messiah, St. Mark's, Sherwood Park, St. Luke/Zion, Grace, Abundant Life/Prince of Peace, Epiphany and Gloria Dei. The new program is a three-year model, composed of two 8-week blocks per year, with one year spent on each of the following: Old Testament, New Testament, and Lutheran Theology/Living. This year will focus on the New Testament during our regular classes, with the Synod Winter Retreat having an Old Testament focus. We hope that subsequent Winter Retreats can serve as a review period for the material covered in the previous year.

This means students going into Grade 7 as well as students going into Grade 8 will be the first ones enrolled in the new program. Registration forms will be available on Welcome Back Sunday September 10th, as well as being emailed to our current list of students. Our Community Missions in action

Toiletry appeal for Rene Deleurme families in September

The René Deleurme Centre (RDC) is a community learning centre in the Louis Riel School Division located on St. Anne's Road. RDC is comprised of various community stakeholders, including a daycare, adult Literacy and EAL programs, newcomer settlement services team, and family outreach team. RDC offers equity-based programming that is responsive to the community they serve. As part of the basic needs support that they offer for community, they have an emergency food cupboard and a community clothing closet, where community members can access food and household goods and gently used clothing as needed.

The RDC has become one of Faith's mission projects and is supported through our annual budget. Four times a year we purchase food and household products that help fill their cupboard. We also purchase winter wear for their clothing closet. (Gently used winter wear can be donated as well.)

Faith's Mission Committee is asking you, our congregation members to support this important mission by filling a bin with much needed toiletries for men, women and children in September. The bin will be labelled and can be found in the narthex. Any donations would be greatly appreciated.

Helping the homeless community through Street Links

90 dozen eggs donated to Street Links over the summer for homeless community

The Missions team has been busy over the summer months, delivering 15 dozen eggs every three weeks – 90 dozen in total – to St. Boniface Street Links for distribution to those experiencing homelessness in St. Boniface and St. Vital. Residents at Street Links' affiliated Morberg House on Provencher gladly accept the deliveries and boil the eggs as needed. The team in their mobile unit then delivers hard boiled eggs in the shell to people at the various encampments along the river and parks.

'It's great protein, and very much appreciated,' says Marion Willis, Executive Director of Street Links.

'We welcome the opportunity to thank Faith Lutheran Church for your ongoing support,' Willis said, recalling the donations of winter parkas and socks, blankets and pillows, medical supplies, 'and the many rounds of delicious chili that were prepared through the winter months.'

September 26, 2023 - *The Diamond Eye* by Kate Quinn

In 1937 in the snowbound city of Kyiv, wry and bookish history student Mila Pavlichenko organizes her life around her library job and her young sonbut Hitler's invasion of Ukraine and Russia sends her on a different path. Given a rifle and sent to join the fight, Mila must forge herself from studious girl to deadly sniper--a lethal hunter of Nazis known as Lady Death. When news of her three hundredth kill makes her a national heroine, Mila finds herself torn from the bloody battlefields of the eastern front and sent to America on a goodwill tour.

Based on a true story, The Diamond Eye is a haunting novel of heroism born of desperation, of a mother who became a soldier, of a woman who found her place in the world and changed the course of history forever.

October 24, 2023 – The Stranger in the Lifeboat by Mitch Albom

Adrift in a raft after a deadly ship explosion, ten people struggle for survival at sea. Three days pass. Short on water, food and hope, they spot a man floating in the waves. They pull him in. "Thank the Lord we found you," a passenger says. "I am the Lord," the man whispers. So begins Mitch Albom's most beguiling novel yet. He ponders what we would do if, after crying out for divine help, God actually appeared before us? A fast-paced, compelling novel that makes you ponder your deepest beliefs, "The Stranger in the Lifeboat suggests that answers to our prayers may be found where we least expect them."

Meet Me at the Museum by Anne Younson

The selection for September is *Lessons in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmen

June 27th, 2024

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel—prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results.

But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one table-spoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo.

The selection for October is *Fayne* by Ann Marie McDonald

Charlotte Bell, a young woman growing up in the 19th century, lives at Fayne House, a vast and lonely estate straddling the border between England and Scotland. Charlotte has been kept from the world by her adoring father, Lord Henry Bell, owing to a mysterious condition.

This idyllic existence is shadowed by the magnificent portrait on the landing in Fayne which depicts Charlotte's long-deceased mother and brother.
