Confirmation Schedule 2024 to 2025

All classes scheduled for Sundays @ 2-3:30PM unless otherwise noted.

Faith participates in a City Wide confirmation program with pastoral and lay leadership from multiple ELCIC Lutheran Churches in metro Winnipeg, and the MNO Synod. The program is designed to begin in Grade 7 and end in Grade 9. Our goal is to help you learn more about the Christian faith, the Lutheran tradition specifically, the life of the church, and provide a place to ask questions, build community and have fun to prepare for the rite of the Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation Sunday). Each year will focus either on the Bible (one year for focus on Hebrew scriptures, another for the New Testament Epistles and Gospels), and a Catechism year where we review Luther's Small Catechism, the history of the Lutheran Church and the way in which we understand ourselves as church today.

We will gather on Sunday afternoons from 2-3:30PM for two 8 week blocks. The first block will begin Sunday September 29 @ Messiah Lutheran Church and run until November 24. Our second block will begin on Sunday January 12 through to March 2nd. Our classes will rotate between congregations (see schedule). Each week, class will be recorded and available to view for those unable to attend in person. In addition to our Sunday classes, there will be additional opportunities to connect faith and life through field trips (TBA) and the MNO Synod's WinterQuest Saturday, February 8th (location and full agenda TBD) which is considered part of the confirmation program. Confirmation materials will be presented to confirmation students at the start of the year.

Confirmation students are expected to attend classes and take on active participation in the worship life and ministry of our congregation which may include serving as a worship assistant (acolyte, lector, greeter/usher, assisting minister, communion server, livestream tech, etc.), or within one of our many groups or committees.

A New and Exciting Approach Towards Children's Ministry

We are excited to share a new approach to Sunday School for this year that recognizes the realities of families in our congregation and allows us to explore interactive, accessible and intergenerational approaches. All while maintaining a firm commitment to providing children and adults with opportunities and resources to form a solid faith foundation as individuals and families.

Welcome Back Sunday on Sept. 22 will be an opportunity to gather as a whole faith community for worship and fellowship. While enjoying the food and activities, families and caregivers can register to receive information about this year's children's ministry resources. **Videos, discussion questions, and colouring sheets will all be shared through an email newsletter,** allowing families to learn together and follow along with the lectionary at home.

Families are always welcome and encouraged to attend worship together. Beginning in October, a **children's message** will introduce scripture and teachings through a video and brief discussion as part of the service. The nursery will be open for children age 0-6, **with age-appropriate books and toys** that will deepen learning and facilitate community-building. **An activity table in the back of the sanctuary** will provide items to pick up for colouring and quiet activities that children (and adults!) can use during worship. Busy bags will continue to be available.

Quarterly Intergenerational activities called "Coffee and Chaos" will invite people of any age to learn, play and create together for 30 minutes after the service. The first one will be December 15 with a focus on the season of Advent. Save the date and more information will be shared in the coming months!



The selection for September 24, 2024 - The Lincoln Highway by Amor Towles

In June, 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson is driven home to Nebraska by the warden of the work farm where he has just served a year for involuntary manslaughter. His mother long gone, his father recently deceased, and the family farm foreclosed upon by the bank, Emmett's intention is to pick up his eight-year-old brother and head west where they can start their lives anew. But when the warden drives away, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm have hidden themselves in the trunk of the warden's car. Together, they have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future.

Spanning just ten days and told from multiple points of view, Towles's third novel will satisfy fans of his multi-layered literary styling while providing them an array of new and richly imagined settings, characters, and themes.

The selection for October 22 2024 - Women Talking by Miriam Toews

One evening, eight Mennonite women climb into a hay loft to conduct a secret meeting. For the past two years, each of these women, and more than a hundred other girls in their colony, has been repeatedly violated in the night by demons coming to punish them for their sins. Now that the women have learned they were in fact drugged and attacked by a group of men from their own community, they are determined to protect themselves and their daughters from future harm.

While the men of the colony are off in the city, attempting to raise enough money to bail out the rapists and bring them home, these women—all illiterate, without any knowledge of the world outside their community and unable even to speak the language of the country they live in—have very little time to make a choice: Should they stay in the only world they've ever known or should they dare to escape?

Based on real events and told through the "minutes" of the women's all-female symposium, Toews's masterful novel uses wry, politically engaged humor to relate this tale of women claiming their own power to decide.

The selection for September is The Valley of Amazement by Amy Tan

A sweeping, evocative epic of two women's intertwined fates and their search for identity, that moves from the lavish parlors of Shanghai courtesans to the fog-shrouded mountains of a remote Chinese village. Spanning more than forty years and two continents, The Valley of Amazement resurrects pivotal episodes in history: from the collapse of China's last imperial dynasty, to the rise of the Republic, the explosive growth of lucrative foreign trade and anti-foreign sentiment, to the inner workings of courtesan houses and the lives of the foreign "Shanghailanders" living in the International Settlement, both erased by World War II.

The selection for October is Five Little Indians by Michelle Good

Taken from their families when they are very small and sent to a remote, church-run residential school, Kenny, Lucy, Clara, Howie and Maisie are barely out of childhood when they are finally released after years of detention. Alone and without any skills, support or families, the teens find their way to the seedy and foreign world of Downtown East side Vancouver,

where they cling together, striving to find a place of safety and belonging in a world that doesn't want them. The paths of the five friends cross and crisscross over the decades as they struggle to overcome, or at least forget, the trauma they endured during their years at the Mission. Fuelled by rage and furious with God, Clara finds her way into the dangerous, highly charged world of the American Indian Movement. Maisie internalizes her pain and continually places herself in dangerous situations. Famous for his daring escapes from the school, Kenny can't stop running and moves restlessly from job to job—through fishing grounds, orchards and logging camps—trying to outrun his memories and his addiction. Lucy finds peace in motherhood and nurtures a secret compulsive disorder as she waits for Kenny to return to the life they once hoped to share together. After almost beating one of his tormentors to death, Howie serves time in prison, then tries once again to re-enter society and begin life anew. With compassion and insight, Five Little Indians chronicles the desperate quest of these residential school survivors to come to terms with their past and, ultimately, find a way forward.
